2014 Longoria Chardonnay Rita's Crown Vineyard

92 Points

My favorite of the lineup was the 2014 Chardonnay Rita's Crown Vineyard, which comes from a terrific site in the Sta. Rita Hills and is all from clone 96. Like the other Chardonnays here, it was barrel-fermented and spent 11 months in 20% new barrels. Stone fruits, peach, mint and floral notes all lead to a medium-bodied, elegant Chardonnay that has stunning purity and precision. It should impress for at least 5-7 years, and if you're so inclined, it will keep longer.

2014 Longoria Chardonnay Fe Ciega Vineyard

91 Points

The 2014 Chardonnay Fe Ciega Vineyard offers additional minerality, smoke and charcoal notes, as well as lots of white peach and apple fruit. Medium-bodied, fresh and focused, it's another rock solid effort from this estate. This 2014 spent ten months in 26% new oak.

2014 Longoria Chardonnay Cuvée Diana

90 Points

Coming from a mix of sites in the Sta. Rita Hills, the 2014 Chardonnay Cuvee Diana is a barrel fermented beauty that spent ten months in 20% new French oak. It offers lots of baking spices, spiced apple, melon and some rocky characteristics in a medium-bodied, bright, fresh and lively style that's ideal for drinking over the coming 5-7 years.

2014 Longoria Evidence

89 Points

The 2013 Evidence is another top notch wine and is made from close to equal parts Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Cabernet Franc, with a tiny splash of Malbec. Aged 21 months in 56% new oak, it offers lots of black currants, plums, pepper and tobacco leaf in a medium-bodied, juicy, enjoyable style. It should evolve nicely through 2023, if not longer.

2013 Longoria Tempranillo

86 Points

Incorporating 10% Syrah and 5% Grenache, the 2013 Tempranillo offers plenty of charred oak, vanilla, liquid smoke and assorted red and black fruits in a medium-bodied, juicy, enjoyable, straightforward package. Drink it over the coming 3-4 years.
